## First Nations Film and Video Festival

November 14th at 7:00pm in the Mary Radmacher Meeting Room

**The American Indian Center of Chicago** opens the 9th annual First Nations Film and Video Festival at Skokie Public Library. The purpose of the festival is to advocate for and celebrate works of Indigenous American film and video that break racial stereotypes and promote awareness of Indigenous American issues. A documentary and a short film will be screened. Ernest Whiteman, filmmaker and Skokie resident, and other representatives from the American Center will be present for Q&A.

**Two Worlds Colliding. NR. 45 minutes.** This 2005 documentary chronicles the painful story of what came to be known as the Saskatoon's infamous "freezing deaths," and the schism between a fearful, mistrustful Aboriginal community and a police force that must come to terms with a shocking secret.

**A Thousand Roads. NR. 43 minutes.** This film, directed by Chris Eyre, is a celebration of relevance of the Native experience to the modern world. There are four stories: a healer, a little girl, a gang banger and a stockbroker. Each character confronts a crisis that arises in a single day and finds the way home.

Check out other movies of interest:

**Black Cloud.** PG-13. An independent film written and directed by actor Rick Schroder, about a young Navajo named Black Cloud who is a talented boxer and has a chance to win a spot on the U.S. Olympic boxing team.

**The Business of Fancydancing.** NR. Marks the directorial debut of distinguished writer Sherman Alexie. Having grown up on the Spokane Reservation, Seymour and his best friend Aristotle follow different paths. Aristotle stays on the rez. Seymour moves away, becoming a writer and activist. They reunite for a friend's funeral.

**The Fast Runner.** R. When Atanarjuat falls in love with a woman already promised to the son of the clan's leader, he has to fight for her. Atanarjuat wins, but the leader plots to attack him. Escaping, he sets off running and embarks on a harrowing adventure. He returns stronger and wiser to reclaim his life. Set in the Canadian Arctic and based on an ancient Inuit legend, this award winning movie is in the Inuktitut language.

**Skins.** R. Mogie and Rudy Yellow Lodge are brothers who live on Pine Ridge reservation, near Mount Rushmore. Both men have different ways of dealing with economic and social hardships pervasive on the rez. Mogie drinks too much and dispenses a lot of sharp criticism. Rudy, a police officer by day, becomes a vigilante at night.

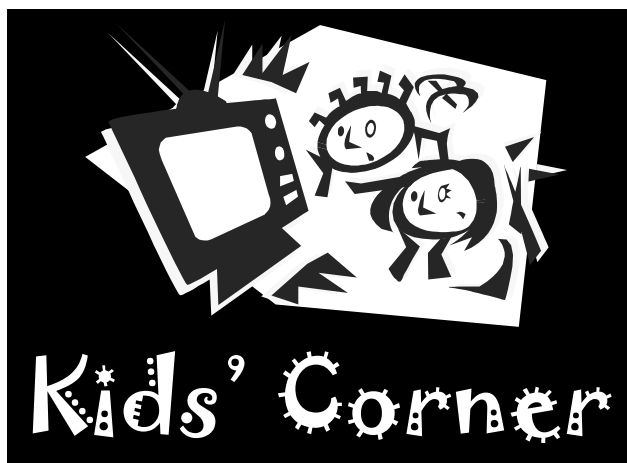
**Smoke Signals.** PG-13. A winner at the Sundance Film Festival and based on the acclaimed book *The Lone Ranger and Tonto Fistfight in Heaven* by Sherman Alexie, *Smoke Signals* is the first film to be written, directed, co-produced, and to feature an American Indian cast. Victor and Thomas, who have lived their entire lives on the reservation, travel to Phoenix when they learn that Victor's father has died. It is a journey of self-discovery and growth. Directed by Chris Eyre.

**Tony Hillerman mysteries made for PBS.** Officer Jim Chee and Lieutenant Joe Leaphorn of the Navajo Tribal Police investigate crimes committed in the Navajo Nation. This noteworthy series features Adam Beach as Jim Chee and Wes Studi as Joe Leaphorn. *Skinwalkers* and *Thief in Time* are directed by Chris Eyre.

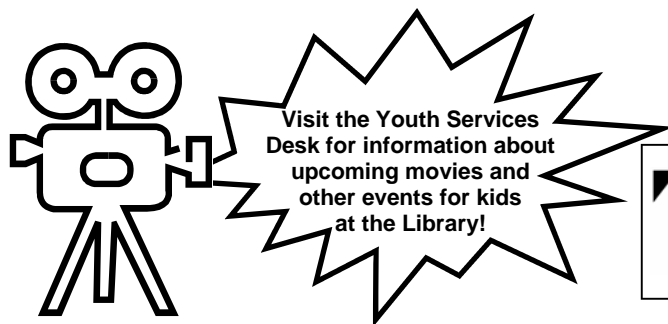
